New Year's Resolutions

How many of you made New Year's Resolutions? Most of us do, but most of us also fail to keep them. Right now 2012 stands before us, new born and ripe with potential. What would you like to get out of this year? A new job? A bigger pay check? A better relationship with your kids or with your parents? A healthier relationship with your spouse? Maybe you want to lose weight or quit smoking or eat better.... Or maybe you would like to finally finish a project or master a skill. What are your dreams for 2012?

I wonder how many of you listed something about G-D? It doesn't have to be something overt like "I want to read the bible every day" or "I want to draw closer to G-D."

The truth is that we set spiritual goals for ourselves all the time, we just don't always recognize them as being spiritual. How many of us want to be better parents, better spouses, better friends, better people? How many of us want to be better citizens... to share more of what we have, to be more grateful for the blessings we have been given, to help make a difference in the lives of others, to help those less fortunate, to be better stewards of our community and our planet? Even though they may not overtly include any reference to G-D, they are all in fact very spiritual goals. Since these are goals that can be shared by people of any faith or even those with no faith or belief in G-D you might wonder what makes them spiritual. They are spiritual in that they reflect our commitment to values higher than simply our own satisfaction or pleasure. Indeed, they show that we believe in something greater and more important than ourselves.

St. Timothy's is committed to being a place that can help you further your spiritual goals, not just those for 2012 but all of them. Indeed, St. Timothy's is more than simply a place in the geographical sense. We are a community. That means that we are committed to helping you reach your individual spiritual goals as well as articulating goals and projects that we will work on together. Some of those goals will be new, others

are time honored and are something that we do year after year.

For example, we are pleased to continue to work as partners in ministry with North Light through our support of their food cupboard, known as FISH, through Santa's Helpers and by again providing a place for their Empty Bowls dinner. We will again host families from Northwest Philadelphia Interfaith Hospitality Network. We will again support one of our own member, in this case Ginny Kaufmann, as she goes to serve on a medical mission. We will reach out to the community by offering Vacation Bible School and St. Francis Fest.

But in order to grow we must also venture out into new areas. This year we will be partnering with Seaman's Church Institute to support their ministry to sailors. We will renew and deepen our ties to St. Timothy's, Barnes Mountain, by sending a mission team to meet the people and work on their homes. We are also renewing our historic ties to Memorial Hospital. Father Kirk is leading a spirituality group there and hopes to further that relationship as 2012 progresses. Finally, we are participating in the Bible Challenge. To date 17 of you have signed up and there is always room for more to join us as we journey through the scriptures.

I don't know about you, but I always find it easier to reach my personal goals if I know that I am not alone. Knowing that there are others who are sharing the challenge with me, who will both support me if I struggle and also will hold me accountable if I slack off helps generate more motivation and energy. Joining with us in one or many of these endeavors can do a lot to help you reach your own spiritual goals. Working together to help others with their basic needs or to intentionally explore your relationship with G-D can make a real difference in your 2012! We just wanted you to know that St. Timothy's is there to support you in that journey and help you fulfill your New Year's resolutions.

Gwynne Peters—Gwynne has attended for more than five years. She serves on the Youth Committee, was a youth mentor and has participated in the Cookie Exchange and Craft Group. She attends the 10:30 service.

Our thanks to outgoing members of Vestry, Larry Birch and Meredith Twardowski. Larry served two terms and has to rotate off. During that time he has served very ably as Property Chair. Meredith completed one term but due to a work-related move is no longer able to stay as involved. She has worked with the Youth Committee. We thank them both for their generous service and wise leadership.

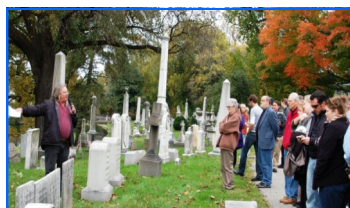
Beer Barons Event

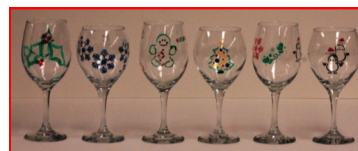
Reception at the Rectory

2012 Bible Challenge

It is hard to believe 2012 is here. This leads me to think of how I can improve my life this year. The sad truth is many clergy don't make enough time to nurture our own personal relationship with G-D. We are too busy or focused on helping our parishioners with their own faith. This describes me well. So I am making my resolution to participate in a program called The Bible Challenge. In short, I am going to read the entire Bible in one year.

It sounds daunting; the Bible is indeed a big book. Yet it also tells the story of the relationship between humanity and G-D. It has the power to inspire, challenge and even offend us. But more than anything you will see it has the power to change our lives.

Spreading it out over a year it doesn't take much time, only 15-30 minutes a day. It doesn't matter which translation you read. The New Revised Standard Version is the one we use for the lessons in church. The New International Version is also popular. If you want to enhance your reading I recommend the New Oxford Annotated Bible as it has excellent footnotes. If you want something more modern I recommend The Message or The Story. The only version I would advise against is the King James. Although its language is poetic it is not easy to understand. And it doesn't matter how or when you read it. You can read in the morning or at night or on lunch break. You can listen to it on your iPod or read it on a Kindle. All that really matters is to do it.

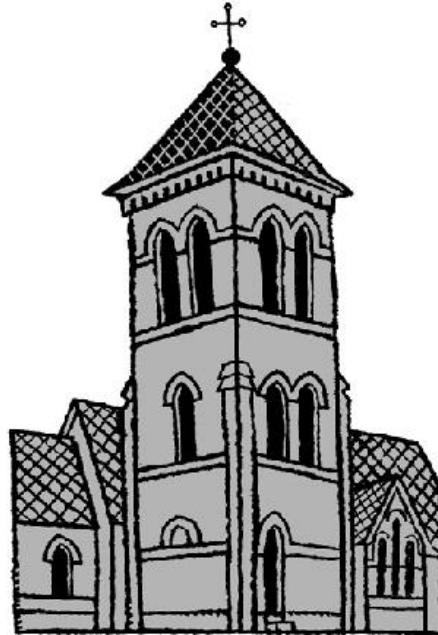
